

When the coronavirus began to spread throughout the U.S., many businesses were forced to close their doors to the public as a safety precaution, including movie theaters. Despite the theaters being closed, some students still found a way to enjoy a movie with friends.

Drive-in movie theaters are considered to be a retro activity that is making a comeback. In the Tampa area, there are two

nearby drive-in theaters. Funlan Drive-In Theatre is located at 2302 E Hillsborough Ave and the Ruskin Family Drive-In Theatre is located at 5011 US-41, Ruskin.

Tickets at Funlan Drive-In, are free for anyone under the age of 4, \$2 for children ages 5 to 11 and \$7 for anyone ages 12 and older. At the Ruskin Family Drive-In, admission is free for those four and younger, \$1 for children ages five to eight and \$6 for people ages 9 and older.

Reagan Gaitens, a sophomore majoring in humanities, said that he and some friends visited the Ruskin Family Drive-In back in July.

"They play two movies back-to-back," Gaitens said. "You pay to get in and you can leave whenever, so you can watch one

or both."

Because theaters haven't released many new movies, the drive-in is playing old movies, according to Gaitens.

"We watched 'Jaws' and 'Back to the Future,'" he said.

Gaitens said that drive-ins are safe for people worried about COVID-19.

"Cars are parked away from each other, so it is automatic social distancing," he said. "Also, masks are required at the snack bar."

Senior accounting major Annamaria Nicotra also believes that going to drive-ins is a safer form of entertainment.

Nicotra said she went to the Fun-Lan Drive-In twice since March.

"I do think it's a safe option

because most people stayed in their cars and everyone was spaced out," Nicotra said.

Along with going to the actual movie theater, Nicotra said she has had a few homemade, drive-in style movie nights at her house as well where she and some friends projected a movie onto a wall at her house.

Other students have also hosted homemade drive-ins in the last six months.

After growing up going to the Ruskin Family Drive-In, Paul Menendez, a junior majoring in electrical engineering, said he organized a drive-in in his backyard in early March for him and some friends.

"I had been excited about the new Pixar movie 'Onward' coming out," Menendez said.

"I also own a projector, and we used a speaker system. I built a couple frames and hung a white bed sheet in order to watch the movie, and it looked really good. We had a lot of people show up and chill in their cars."

Roughly 10 of his friends between six cars showed up to the homemade drive-in, according to Menendez. He said he was happy to have been able to watch the movie alongside his friends.

"I wanted to watch the movie with my friends, but most of them weren't comfortable meeting in person to watch," he said. "I figured that people would feel safe if they were in their own cars."

One of his friends in attendance, CJ Paskert, a senior

has been one of the best-selling games on Nintendo's eShop since its release in early March. The current king of the Nintendo Switch is a simple island simulator game, but its charm is what makes it great.

You start off having just recently won an exclusive island getaway package. Once you reach your island destination you're joined by two animal villagers — the first inhabitants of your fledgling town — and you immediately owe a lump sum of money to the business tycoon Tom Nook.

How do you pay off your debt? Explore the island — catch bugs, pick fruit, plant flowers, build lots of stuff and slowly turn your measly deserted island into a bustling community. Over time, you'll have enough bells — that's the currency — to pay off your eventual island mansion in full.

With hundreds of unique and often hilarious animal villagers to interact with, countless challenges, contests and unlimited building possibilities, there's something here for everyone.

Ghost of Tsushima

In this open-world action-adventure game set in 13th century Japan, you play as Jin Sakai, a samurai who usually plays by the books and follows a traditional code.

That all changes when the Mongol Empire invades his island home of Tsushima, and Jin has to turn to alternative and

un-samurai-like tactics to combat this new ruthless enemy.

As a result, he becomes the terrifying and notorious warrior known as the Ghost of Tsushima.

This is a game for those who love a good revenge plot or those who have always dreamed of being in an Akira Kurosawa film. There's actually a grainy black and white film mode that you can play the game in, so feel free to live out your "Seven Samurai" dream.

A solid story of redemption and revenge coupled with some of the most beautiful visuals ever seen in a game make "Ghosts of Tsushima" well worth it for anyone who's looking to be immersed in Kamakura Period Japan or wants to experience what it's like to be a badass samurai.

Microsoft Flight Simulator

Here's a dilemma — you really want to fly a plane anywhere in the world, but you don't have the time, money or desire to go to flight school.

Well if you have an extra \$60 lying around, you're in luck.

"Microsoft Flight Simulator" lets you fly more than 20 different planes to 37,000 unique airports from all over the world, all while soaking in a hyperrealistic map that uses data from Bing Maps in real time.

Yes, you can even fly over your own home. It's ridiculously cool.

It's a pretty straightforward game with a super detailed environment based on terabytes of textures and satellite imagery. Play it too long and you'll probably start to lose a grip on reality.

If you're an aviation enthusiast or if you just want to get lost in some photo-realistic clouds, then "Microsoft Flight Simulator" has everything you could ever want, if not more.

is your go-to game for anyone looking for a balance between strategy and role-playing.

You play as a customized character in the fictional land of Calradia during a time of war. The Empire faction is crumbling, and eight unique factions are scrambling for control. As the player, you can join any faction, or if you're feeling adventurous, you can start your own.

After a short tutorial, how you play is entirely up to you. Want to help the Empire rebuild itself and take over the map? How about joining the Khuzait, a Mongol-like faction, and wreak havoc? Or you can avoid the war altogether and make your way as a traveling merchant and become a butter-selling mogul.

The choice is entirely up to you, and whatever route you take





The new era of streaming services

After public facilities closed nationwide in late March, COVID-19 has affected various industries — but none seemingly as much as the movie theater industry.

It's no surprise that movie theaters have been hit hard by the public health guidelines implemented, with a \$10 billion loss in revenue as of May, according to Statista Research Expert Amy Watson.

Many movie production companies have had to adjust to the nationwide closure that happened in March by delaying the release dates for highly anticipated movies. Movies such as "Antebellum," "A Quiet Place Part II," "Black Widow," "Candyman," "The French Dispatch," "In The Heights," "No Time to Die," "Wonder Woman 1984" and "Mulan" were supposed to come out in theaters over the summer.

The National Association of Theater Owners requested financial assistance from the government back in March, when the pandemic first began shutting down many public theaters, according to AP News.

It doesn't help that some big studios elected to move their films onto streaming services so that audiences can access them at home, including Warner Brother's "Birds Of Prey" and Universal Pictures' "The Invisible Man."

One of the biggest media

conglomerates, Disney, made a bold move and skipped an appearance in the theaters altogether.

Lately, the delay of Disney's live-action "Mulan" has been of particular discussion by Disney fans and viewers when Disney made the decision to not release it in theaters at all and just release it on its streaming platform Disney+.

Although "Mulan" was released on Disney+ on Sept. 4, subscribers to the streaming service must pay an additional fee of \$29.99 for unlimited access until it's released on the service under normal streaming circumstances on Dec. 4.

Unlike Disney's unique decision to avoid releasing its movie in theaters, director Christopher Nolan chose to release his anticipated movie "Tenet" in theaters on Sept. 3.

Unlike other movies, which continued to postpone their release dates due to the limited capacity of movie theaters, "Tenet" was actually released. The release of the action movie starring John David Washington and Robert Pattinson detailing their interactive journey through inverted time was postponed from its July 17 release date to Sept. 3.

Nolan received backlash from his colleagues in the movie industry as well as columnists like Kyle Buchanan at The New York Times for his decision to show the movie in theaters, knowing the high anticipation for it and the large fanbase Nolan holds among moviegoers.

Pictures' decision to release new movies. "For a while, it seemed like the answer was to kill his greatest fans. But that's not the answer of today, it seems, so that's good. But we have no idea. We don't want to be the first to rush into anything."

Nolan became a very popular director through his work with "Inception," another time-bending movie that grossed \$833.6 million at the box office upon its release. He is also well-known for directing "The Dark Knight" trilogy of the Batman franchise.

If the release of a popular, highly awaited movie wasn't enough to incentivize people to head to the theater in their

free time, AMC Theaters had a special deal for its reopening date on Aug. 20 of about 100 locations nationwide, according to online media company Insider.

Movie tickets were sold for 15 cents — an almost 99 percent decrease from what an adult movie ticket usually costs. This price point is unheard of, even for student or senior discounts.

AMC promoted its 15 cent price for reopening as "movies in 2020 at 1920 prices," according to various articles from CNN, CBS and the Tampa Bay Times.

The theater chain has also lowered the cost of its AMC Stubs A-list membership, charging those who sign up for the three-month contract only \$5 for

their first month. The program allows its members to see three movies per week for the monthly subscription price, which is usually \$20 a month.

Even with these deals, the theaters are remaining relatively empty, especially with plenty of streaming services offering a wide range of movies, documentaries and TV shows to pass the time at home.

Many have been taking advantage of the Google Chrome extension feature "Netflix Party" which allows multiple users to watch movies or shows on Netflix together while in different locations by syncing their accounts.




