The ins and outs of the 2021 spring commencement


Questions surrounding the 2021 spring graduations have floated around Facebook groups and group chats since the in-person events were announced, so it's time to clear the air about this year's commencement.

As of April 23, 3,000 students have registered to attend graduation. The ceremonies, scheduled May 8 at 9 a.m. and 6:30 p.m., will feature speeches from USF President Steven Currall as well as Provost Ralph Wilcox and will last approximately 2.5 hours.

Both ceremonies, held at the Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, will be divided by colleges. The 9 a.m. ceremony will honor graduates from the colleges of Behavioral and Community Sciences, Business, Education, Medicine, Nursing, Pharmacy and Public Health while the 6:30 p.m. ceremony will feature graduates from the colleges of Arts and Sciences, Engineering, Global Sustainability, Graduate Studies, Marine Science, the Arts and the Office of Undergraduate Studies.

Without the traditional walk across the stage, graduates will be able to stand at their seats and have their names read aloud during the in-person spring commencement ceremonies.

software company managing tickets, will be supplying each graduate with two tickets each, both of which are nontransferable. Graduates will not need to take any extra steps to secure their guest tickets as they will be sent by Cvent prior to the ceremonies, according to university spokesperson Adam Freeman.

"The university is unable to accommodate any additional guest ticket requests. Guest tickets are also nontransferable and should be treated as valuable — once you share your ticket with someone there is nothing you or the university can do to revoke that ticket," the commencement team said.

The commencement team will provide more information regarding guest tickets within the next two weeks. If a student needs to request accessible seating for any of their guests, they must contact the commencement team to make the appropriate arrangements.

All attendees ages two or older will require a ticket, which will also count toward the students' two-guest limit, according to the commencement team.

As a health precaution, students will be required to complete the USF Daily Symptom Check and provide proof of its completion when they check in at each ceremony.

During the ceremony, all graduates and attendees will be required to wear face masks as well as be seated 6 feet apart to comply with social distancing guidelines.

The venue will also receive a "deep cleaning" between ceremonies to mitigate the risks of spreading COVID-19, according to Freeman.

While each student will only be allowed to bring two guests during the in-person ceremony, other family members and friends will also get to celebrate the occasion by watching the commencement's livestream on the university's website.

As a souvenir from the big day, graduates' names will be included in the commencement program if they meet certain criteria. Bachelor's and master's students should have applied for graduation on OASIS by their respective deadline set by the Registrar's Office.

Students graduating with their Ph.D. and Ed.D. should have completed their Electronic Thesis and Dissertation submission by the Graduate Studies Office deadline while students with

doctorates in Audiology, Business Administration, Physical Therapy, Nursing Practice, Pharmacy and Public Health must meet their program's specific requirements for inclusion in the program.

The students' privacy settings on their student records will also decide whether their name will be on the program or not.

"It is important to note that a student's name not appearing in the program does not necessarily mean they are not graduating — it could be just a reflection of missing the deadline and/or not having granted the university permission to publish their name," the commencement team

The commencement programs will be handed out during both ceremonies. If there are any leftovers available, they will be distributed to each campus after the event.

Students who decide not to attend the May 8 ceremonies due to health and safety concerns will be given the chance to attend the makeup commencement for the spring, summer and fall 2020 classes who had their ceremonies postponed. The dates, however, have not been determined yet. The university will provide more updates about makeup commencement when more information becomes available.

After throwing caps and celebrating their accomplishments to the sound of "Pomp and Circumstance," graduates can expect to receive their valuable, and longawaited diploma through the mail approximately six to eight weeks after the end of the spring semester.

Graduate school offers students a way to master their trades

soon-to-be-graduates prepare to start the job hunt, many might face the challenge of obtaining a high-paying job without certain credentials that go beyond a bachelor's degree. To rise above the competition, some students choose to stack up degrees.

Once a student graduates, there are many pathways that can be taken to attain success, such as going straight into the workforce, taking a gap year, becoming an intern or jumping into a graduate program.

Becoming a graduate student can be beneficial in more ways than one. It can provide a mass amount of insight, experience and education beyond a bachelor's degree by pushing students to their academic limits and allowing them to explore their chosen subject in depth.

Extending one's collegiate career is a path some students decide to take, as 16.5% of college graduates make the decision to continue their education and receive a higher degree, according to College Graduation Statistics by Educational Data.

Students who complete college with a master's are more attractive to a future employer compared to a colleague who may only have a bachelor's degree. Graduate students are

getting noticed frequently in today's job market.

Those who continue their education to earn a graduate degree are known to earn 28% more than those with a bachelor's, according to a 2021 metadata research study by Georgetown University.

The skills gained in graduate school such as critical thinking, higher-level problem solving and effective communication are applicable skills that can help with any career avenue.

The number of graduate students within the USF community is significantly smaller than the number of undergraduate students. The total number of graduate students at USF in the 2020-21 academic year is 9,634 whereas undergraduate is at an enrollment of 37,207. The smaller class size means that while taking a graduate program, students will be introduced to several like-minded individuals that will gain a stronger and more efficient connection.

Pursuing graduate school presents students with a small connected group of people. Compared to undergraduate lectures, graduate courses are offered with only a small amount of seats to fill. Undergraduate classes are frequently larger and less individualized compared to graduate courses, according to Study in the USA.

Various benefits arise from a smaller sized class, including gaining connections quicker, developing a relationship with a professor and being more involved in the material being

However, this can be a daunting task for some. Coordinating outfits, finding a photographer and a good location to shoot all serve as roadblocks to overcome in an effort to get the perfect picture. Luckily, below are some suggestions for places to commemorate the occasion.

Lettuce Lake Park

Lettuce Lake Park is a short drive away from the USF Tampa campus, down Fletcher Avenue. Graduates can take their photos on the boardwalk overlooking the Hillsborough River, which flows through the park, with algae and duckweed coating the water's surface.

The tall trees can create some captivating shadows as the sun gets filtered through the numerous branches. Some local fauna may also show up in the background like turtles, birds and, if you're lucky, a sunbathing alligator.

The park has a \$2 entry fee per vehicle and is open from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. every day in the spring and summer.

of a natural landscape with downtown scenery. The park provides yet another waterfront view, with downtown St. Petersburg in the background, but also an abundance of palm trees

taught. Building relationships while being a graduate student can help evolve your network. Not only are connections being made with other driven and motivated students but with professionals and faculty as well.

USF offers over 150 master's, specialist and doctoral-level degrees as well as over 100 different graduate certificates that can be completed both online and in person. The variety of programs offered for a master's degree and what they consist of can be found on the Office of Graduate Studies' website.

Many of these majors offered at USF ranked nationwide in the 2021 U.S. News and World Report Graduate School Rankings, with 10 graduate programs including audiology, physical therapy and nursing ranked in the top 50 as well as five online graduate degree programs in the top 100. This allows students not only to


further their education, but to do so within nationally recognized programs.

Each student will have to apply through the USF graduate application link to begin taking courses and starting a graduate

The deadline to apply for graduate school for the fall semester at all campuses is June I, the spring semester deadline is Oct. 15 and the summer 2022 deadline is Feb. 15.

Students from all USF campuses can have the opportunity to endeavor in furthering their education in any way they decide.

Becoming a graduate student to earn a master's degree can open up several doors. Potential benefits that can come from taking this step further educationally can consist of an increase in job opportunities, earning a higher paycheck and gaining stronger credibility.

TOBACCO USE IN THE BLACK COMMUNITY



Take action to unearth and rectify the societal imbalance that is the toll of tobacco on the Black community.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

The tobacco-related health impacts on the Black community are devastating. Inequalities in health access and Big Tobacco's tactics have had lasting, negative consequences.

- For years, the tobacco industry has **heavily marketed and promoted menthol cigarettes to the Black community** using culturally tailored advertising images and messages.
- Marketing of menthol products includes efforts like supporting cultural events and making contributions to minority education institutions and scholarship programs.
- People in the Black community may **hesitate to seek care because they distrust healthcare systems**, which have been responsible for inequities in treatment.
- African Americans usually smoke fewer cigarettes and start smoking at older ages, but are more likely to die from smoking-related diseases compared to white Americans.

HOW TO TAKE ACTION AT THE UNIVERSITY LEVEL



EDUCATE your local fraternities, sororities and student unions about the toll of tobacco on the Black community. Learning is the first step to making change.



ENGAGE your school's administration to talk about this important social justice and public health issue.



EMPOWER student organizations to encourage local elected officials to discuss policies that can help combat tobacco-related injustices against the Black community.
