# Theme park holiday celebrations to visit

As people get into the holiday spirit, amusement parks across Florida have lined up holiday entertainment for those wishing to celebrate. From parades to live performances and firework shows, Floridians will be able to make the most of this holiday season.

#### Mickey's Very Merry Christmas Party

Running from November to December, Disney's Magic Kingdom hosts a special holiday event called "Mickey's Very Merry Christmas."

The celebration features fireworks, a snow filled parade on Main street, stage shows and other entertainment. The lineup for this year's celebration includes: Mickey's Most Merriest Celebration, Minnie's Wonderful Christmastime Fireworks, Mickey's Once Upon A Christmastime Parade, A Totally Tomorrowland Christmas, Storybook Circus Disney Junior Jingle Jam and Club Tinsel in Tomorrowland.

To watch fireworks and sing along to your favorite holiday songs, check out Minnie's Wonderful Christmastime Fireworks. Starting at 10 p.m. This show is offered on certain nights starting Nov. 8 until Dec. 22.

If you choose to check out Mickey's Once Upon A Christmastime Parade, you'll get to watch dancing gingerbread men, toy soldiers and wave hello to some of your favorite Disney characters. The parade starts at 8:30 p.m. in Frontierland and ends at II p.m. on Main Street.

Tickets can be bought online

or by calling 407-939-4240 with prices ranging from \$149 to \$199. Though tickets are currently sold out, it is possible that tickets become available with last minute cancellations or capacity changes.

#### Christmas at Universal Studios

Over in Orlando, Universal Studios' Christmas celebrations feature events in both parks to cater to those feeling in the holiday spirit. The celebrations start as soon as Nov. 12 and end on Jan. 1.

If you are a Harry Potter fan, you might want to check out Christmas at Diagon Alley. Fireworks and holiday decorations will mark the streets of Hogsmeade and the walls of Hogwarts this season. While you sip on hot butterbeer, you can listen to the Frog Choir and Celestina Warbeck and the Banshees as they bring some holiday cheer with their performances.

Music lovers should check out live performances from Mannheim Steamroller on Dec. 3, 4, 10 and 11 at 7 p.m.

You can also enjoy Universal's Holiday Parade featuring Macy's this Christmas season. The parade features 15 handcrafted floats and spans over 26 miles throughout the park. You should expect appearances from popular characters such as Minions from "Despicable Me" and Dreamworks' "Shrek" and "Madagascar" movies. The parade is open during park hours from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m.

For some nostalgia, Seuss Landing will be decorated with the charm of Whowville alongside visits from resident Whos and the Grinch himself. To watch a live retelling of the

tale starring the Grinch, you can visit the Grinchmas Who-liday Spectacular. This celebration will be located in Seuss Landing in Universal's Islands of Adventure and will be open from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Admission for the events are included with your theme park ticket or annual pass. If you are looking for a more exclusive visit, Universal Studios also offers an add-on for the Universal Holiday Tour for \$79.99 per person.

The add-on includes meet and greets with the Grinch and Santa Claus, reserved seating for the Grinchmas Who-liday spectacular, small meals, priority access to one attraction and an after-hours showing of The Magic of Christmas at Hogwarts Castle.

#### Busch Gardens' Christmas Town

If you are looking for celebrations closer to home in Tampa, Busch Gardens' Christmas Town will get you in the holiday spirit with fun rides and festive shows like the Holly Jolly Express and Christmas on Ice.

Busch Gardens' longest running classic holiday show Christmas on Ice will open again this year at The Moroccan Palace Theater. World-class skaters will put on a show featuring holidaythemed costumes and songs. The show will run every two hours starting at I p.m. until 8 p.m. for those who wish to check it out.

The Holly Jolly Express allows you to take in Busch Gardens' views while listening to holiday songs. Guests will witness the giraffes, rhinos and zebras living in the park as they celebrate the holiday season.

For a colorful sight, make sure to check out Holidays in the Sky: A Fireworks Spectacular, which features holiday tunes and a Christmas-colored fireworks display. The shows are offered on Saturdays for the months of November and December starting at 9 p.m., with the exception of Christmas Eve when fireworks will begin an hour earlier. You can also celebrate the new year with some explosive fireworks at 12 a.m. at Busch Gardens.

Guests will be able to visit Busch Gardens' Christmas Town until Jan. 9 with their park ticket, valid Fun Card or annual pass.

Nothing says "'tis the season to be jolly" like a good holiday movie, but maybe find ways to add to that experience. Set your thermostat a little lower and use the environment in your favor, by setting fire crackling sounds on your favorite music streaming app or YouTube. If you are a student on a budget, this is a perfect plan to gather your friends and share snacks.

Why watch Hallmark movies while decorating a tree when you can feel like you are part of the plot? Enchant, presented by the Hallmark Channel, is a proper winter wonderland experience at the Tampa Bay Rays Stadium in St. Petersburg. Tickets run for \$35, which includes access to a maze of Christmas lights and a 1,000-foot tree, an ice skating path around the stadium and a conglomerate of artisan shops called The Village.

Wanting to feel the spirit from the comfort of your car while listening to Michael Buble? Tampa Bay's Festival of Lights held in the Greater Hillsborough County fair consists of a 2-mile drive-thru featuring over a million different lights. The tickets vary from \$20 to \$25 with up to eight people per car. The drive-thru is available from Thursday to Sunday after 6 p.m., when the lights are officially on.

While the main idea is to escape the heat and relish in the cold weather, if you are looking to embrace Florida's tropical aspects, the Edgewater Park Holiday Boat parade in Dunedin is a free event held Dec. 2 and 3 from 6-9 p.m. The boat show will bring Christmas cheer while still welcoming the Floridian waterfront, the perfect holiday crossover.

A winter experience presented by Tampa's own hockey team, the Tampa Bay Lightning, winter village at Curtis Hixon Park might be the right thing for you. While the park on Riverwalk completely changed to match the Holiday colors and light, from now until Jan. 4 the ice rink is accessible to all ages and the \$17 tickets also cover the ice skate rental.

Whether you are looking for a full winter experience or a single magical moment to share with friends and family, there is no need to leave a warm and inviting Florida to experience a classic white Christmas.

# Three ways to deal with the holiday blues

Seasonal depression affects 6% of the total U.S. population, with another 14% of adults suffering from a lesser form of depression known as "winter blues," according to the National Institute of Health.

To prioritize your personal well-being, practice mindfulness during the holidays. If you feel isolated or lonely during the season, try to seek out activities around you, whether they be on campus or within your local community. If you're feeling unwanted stress, it may also be useful to talk to family members and friends — don't be afraid to host a FaceTime or Zoom party to get together if you're unable to see everyone in person.

#### Accept that as seasons change, so do you




